Statement of Need

Please describe the need for this project. For example, how will this project impact student learning?

Each child needs to see the world of learning as something fun. I want my students to enjoy learning, and to look forward to coming to school each day! The way to do this is to engage each and every kindergartner in every subject I am teaching. If the students are engaged, then they are more likely to enjoy and learn the concept I am teaching.

With the lack of interactive technology available in my classroom, the students are unable to come up to the board and interact with the lessons being taught. A Mimio Interactive Projector will make this hands-on learning a reality in my classroom. It is proven that actually doing a task is more effective than simply watching something be done. Interactive technology in my classroom will allow students to take part and do; not just see. The technology should have a positive impact on classroom behaviors, as students will want to use the device and will be good listeners and active participants in order to receive a turn. Having a Mimio Interactive Projector in my room will have a positive effect on student participation, engagement and, in turn, assessment scores.

Primary Goal

Please describe the primary goal of the project and how it blends with School District 2 goals and curriculum.

In the Billings Public Schools District, we are lucky enough to have the new reading program, Lead21. Along with this great program comes technology available to all students. Interactive games and books are all available to use as learning tools. If given the opportunity to purchase a Mimio Interactive Projector for my room, lessons that are aligned with the Lead 21 reading program, as well as many Common Core State Standards, will be taught in an engaging and interactive way. I plan to enrich my lessons by bringing in technology when needed to enhance the lessons and topics we are focusing on. Each child learns in his or her own way, whether it be kinesthetically, visually, or pictorially. With the option of using this technology when appropriate, I will be able to address more of the skills needed in each of these different learning styles.

Project Description

Briefly identify the major activities and materials involved in your project.

Once a Mimio projector is placed into my classroom I will begin integrating it into our daily routine immediately. In my kindergarten classroom, our day will begin with a warm up activity to get all children focused and ready to learn. The Lead 21 concepts book will be introduced through the online resources, and an introductory game integrating unit vocabulary will get students engaged with the Lead 21 theme. As the day goes on, students will be engaged in hands-on activities in the areas of math, phonics, science, and reading. Attached to this application are examples of activities students could do independently at centers or throughout a lesson to keep students involved and interested. As a teacher I also have the options of scanning paper activities for the students to interactively on the board. Students' work and input can be easily saved through the Projector's software and stored for assessment or personal teaching reflection.

Alongside all of the themes taught in the curriculum, I plan to bring in supplemental material and activities, such as World Book Online and BrainPOP Jr., to expand the scope of learning on these topics. Each of these resources has dozens of interactive components that students can complete independently or as a whole group lesson.

Professional Development

If your project includes professional development how will it improve student performance?

Although I am familiar with using a similar interactive device in a previous school, I plan to engage in any professional development course or training that is available to maximize my understanding of the Mimio device and its software. As a first year teacher I am constantly looking at how I can improve learning in my classroom. I am passionate about increasing the level of interaction and engagement in my Kindergarteners.

As a school, it is a primary goal of the Beartooth technology committee to get as many interactive devices into the school as possible. Purchasing multiple Mimio Interactive Projectors for our building will ensure many opportunities for collaboration and growth in using this technology.

Project Timeline

When will you implement your project?

If awarded this grant through the Education Foundation, I plan to begin using the device as soon as it is received. The impact on my classroom should begin late this spring, or next fall, 2014. I hope to immediately immerse my children into the benefits of interactively learning in the classroom. On a daily basis, the software and projector will be implemented into my lesson planning.

Plan for Evaluation

How will you evaluate student outcomes for your project?

Students' work can be saved and stored through the Mimio software for further evaluation or assessment on most all activities. I plan to use this technology for independent center work as well as whole group instruction. To evaluate the effectiveness of the device in my room, students' understanding of topics and test scores from this current year (without interactive technology in the classroom) will be compared to the 2014-2015 year with the projector present. .
