Kindle Fire HD books are an excellent resource for any classroom. With Kindle Fire HD's, students no longer need to be discouraged by the size of a book or self conscious about reading levels, motivating the most reluctant and struggling readers. Across all reading levels, Kindle Fire HD's can help meet the individual needs of students with adjustable fonts and line spacing. One of the most useful Kindle features is the built in dictionary. The dictionary is easy to access and is a quick way for students to find the definition for of an unknown word. Students can add their own notes, highlights, and bookmarks that they can access from their Kindle, creating a truly personalized reading experience.

Student motivation plays a large part in reading comprehension. Many schools across the country have used Kindle Fire HD's to motivate and engage students in reading. Lotta C. Larson, Professor of Education at Kansas State University conducted a yearlong study to determine whether the use of Kindles impacted primary students and found that students who received Kindles significantly improved literacy and vocabulary development. Research also shows that when books are easily accessible to students, it creates more reading opportunities in which more learning occurs. Additionally, many researchers have reported a shorter attention span among young people today, driven by the ease with which information can be accessed.

Many of the students at Orchard have limited access to technology, books and Apps. With this grant we will be able to purchase Kindle Fire HD's that we can use in our classrooms that will enhance and motivate students to feel successful in their reading and other academic areas.

Kindle Fire HD's in the classroom will be used to help motivate students and enhance their learning experience. The Kindle Fire HD's will be able to download books and various applications to assist our students in a variety of way academic areas:

- Reading Books (leveled text based in individual reading levels)
- Phonemic awareness (the ability to hear and manipulate individual phonemes/sounds)
- Phonological awareness (the ability to hear and manipulate larger units of sound, onset, rime, and syllables)
- High frequency sight words (the most commonly used words in printed text that are phonetically irregular which creates a need for students to memorize them to be able to read fluently)
 - Building addition and subtraction fluency
 - Upper and lower case letter and number formation
 - · Learning letters and sounds

Project Description

Kindle Fire HD's are designed for reading across all reading levels and offers a unique blend between the computer and the book. At a very basic level, Kindle Fire HD's are affordable and easily accessible with parental controls that can limit their access to unwanted areas. Kindle Fire HD's can help meet the individual needs of all students. Kindle Fire HD's excited the students about reading and other language art areas.

One feature that we intend to use is called Whispercast. This feature allows teachers to access a collection of over 1 million books, newspapers, and magazines, including millions of free, out of copy titles and distribute to an entire class wirelessly in a matter of minutes. This feature automatically saves and synchronizes the furthest page read, bookmarks, notes, and highlights across all devises so that with use, students can pick up where they left off on another device.

To ensure the safety of all students, Kindle Fire HD's are an excellent choice because it does not feature a camera, microphone, or HDMI port and offers the ability to block Facebook and Twitter integration, web browsing, and content purchasing. We have the ability to create profiles and set time limits for students using Kindle FreeTime.

We would like to purchase Kindle Fire HD's to be able to provide all students with more opportunities while focusing on differentiating their needs and focusing on specific skills they are working on mastering. The Kindle Fire HD's will be used during our reading group time to reinforce academic skills. They will be able to work on their own ability and comfort level. They would be able to have more phonemic awareness lesson along with formation of letters. Our intent is to use these devices as a tool to impact literacy development with emerging readers by offering a variety of engaging apps and print sources to help build all levels of learning in math, science, language arts and reading.
